Interview with Viapath's Estates and Environment Director

Now you've seen the video featuring our new hub laboratory, meet one of our colleagues with a key role in delivering the vision to create a world-leading, integrated pathology network.

Estates and Environment Director Andy Hockin recently joined the Viapath Executive team and will be responsible for the management of properties and facilities, working with the Trust Estates teams.

A microbiologist with more than 20 years' experience of managing multi-disciplinary laboratories across Europe, Andy's primary focus will be on the hub laboratory and the reconfiguration of Essential Service Laboratories which will remain on Trust sites. He is also responsible for Health & Safety and Procurement, work which will involve ensuring all future designs are COVID compliant and negotiating better deals on resources and equipment.

Transformation Leads appointed

Three Transformation Leads covering Infection Sciences, Blood Sciences and Tissue Sciences have been appointed within our pathology partnership in South East London.

These are critical roles within the transformation team and will involve working with consultant pathologists, external colleagues and the hospital trusts to design, develop and deliver an end-to-end service which enables the successful delivery of the pathology programme.

The Transformation Leads bring with them extensive experience and insight, which will be invaluable in helping to design solutions and working environments that encourage both innovation and top-class service delivery. We are delighted to introduce them:

Khadijah Owusu-Ansah (Tissue Sciences): Khadijah joined Viapath in 2015 and has more than 20 years' experience working in histopathology within the NHS. She currently manages the King's College Hospital Tissue Sciences service and has just taken on the service delivery of liver histopathology. A Fellow of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences, Khadijah has introduced lean working methods that have helped to shape a high-performing department with patient needs at its heart.



Darren Costello (Blood Sciences): Darren joined Viapath in 2013 and has extensive experience in the design, development and configuration of pathology laboratories, in order to develop lean and efficient services. A fellow of the Institute of Biomedical Sciences (FIBMS), he is responsible for the scientific, leadership and management training and development of various Viapath colleagues and contributes to financial recovery plans through quality, innovation, productivity and prevention strategies.



Fearghal Tucker (Infection Sciences): With more than 20 years' experience in the NHS, Fearghal joined Viapath in 2016 and has introduced many new technologies into laboratories, the most significant being MALDI-TOF, which is used for the rapid and accurate identification of micro-organisms. He has spoken at many national and international conferences on such achievements, as well as about his time managing a PHE laboratory in Sierra Leone in 2015, to diagnose Ebola as part of the international response to the epidemic.



Congratulations to Fearghal, Darren and Khadijah on their new roles. We all look forward to working with them during the transformation journey.

We're delighted to be able to share with you a new way of keeping you informed about our journey towards becoming a world-leading integrated pathology network.


As the transformation process is happening so quickly, the quarterly Viapath employee roadshows will be replaced by two meetings taking place every six weeks - Leadership and Colleague Briefings. These will both be attended by members of the Executive and Transformation teams.

Leadership Briefings – these sessions are aimed at the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and are designed to give these managers an overview of what we'll be sharing in the Colleague Briefings. This will allow them the opportunity to ask their questions and reflect on the content, leaving them well placed to add context should their teams have questions following the subsequent Colleague Briefing.
